

Journal Helminthologia publishes peer-reviewed original scientific articles, review articles, case reports, and research notes on different helminthology topics. This is particularly true of helminths in human and animal hosts and plant nematodes affecting the environment, involving health status, or are of veterinary importance. In addition, any article studying combined infection or relationship between helminths and endo (protozoan) or exo-parasites is appropriate and would be considered. Book reviews, Editorials, and Letters to the Editor presenting comments on material published in this journal are also welcome.

Submission of a manuscript implies that the work described has not been published elsewhere (except in the form of an abstract, poster, or part of a published lecture or thesis); that is not under peer review or consideration for publication in any other journal. Submitted manuscripts must be approved by all co-authors and the responsible institutional authorities where the study and experiments have been carried out. The publisher and journal owner will not be held legally responsible for any claims or compensations.

Helminthologia provides immediate Open Access to its content under the Creative Commons BY 4.0 license. Authors who publish in this journal retain all copyrights and agree to the above-mentioned CC BY 4.0 license terms. (https://creativecommons.org/licenses/ by/4.0/). Online Manuscript Submission

Helminthologia offers authors and reviewers online manuscript submission and a peer-review system available at https://www. editorialmanager.com/helminthologia/. Authors should register themselves first as new users and then upload their manuscripts following the on-screen instructions. Should you encounter difficulties while submitting your manuscript online and wish to submit it via e-mail, don't hesitate to contact Dr. Zuzana Vasilková (Managing Editor) at helminth@saske.sk. The authors are strongly encouraged to use the journal online submission editorial system for quicker and more efficient processing.

Upon successful initial review and compliance with all required journal instructions for the authors, all submitted manuscripts are subject to a single-blind peer-review process with at least two reviewers involved.

Electronic submission substantially reduces the editorial processing and reviewing times and shortens the overall publication times.

Paper Writing Guide

Manuscripts, written in English, should be submitted in MS Word (97 or higher) either as a standard DOCUMENT (.doc or .docx) or RICH TEXT FORMAT (.rtf). Use a regular plain font (e.g., Times New Roman) for writing. All references should be written in a format as requested and described in journal guidelines, and with DOI-s provided. <u>Any manuscript not following these basic rules will not pass preliminary review and will be returned for revision and correction.</u>

Arrangement of the Manuscript

The title page should contain concise info that must include the title, the author's name (s) without titles, author(s) affiliations and institutional addresses, and personal e-mail addresses.

Authors are asked to ensure that line and page numbering is included in the main text file of their manuscript at the time of submission to facilitate peer-review.

Elements of the Manuscript

Please arrange the elements in this order:

- Summary
- Text: o Introduction
 - Material and Methods
 - Ethical Approval and/or Informed Consent
 - o Results
 - Discussion (Results and Discussion may be combined in one section)
 - o Conflict of Interest
 - o Acknowledgement
 - References
- Tables, Figures, Illustrations, Legends

Summary must accompany every manuscript. It should present the most important results and conclusions in 300 words maximum. Following the abstract body, 3 to 6 key words, separated by semi-colons, should be listed for indexing.

Text - General Rules

We suggest that the English language be proofread and edited by a native speaker for its correctness before submitting the manuscript.

Genus and species names should be in italics. The common names of animals should not be capitalized. When describing a new species (and other new taxa), please provide an exact address where the specimens are deposited, including the collection numbers of holotypes, paratypes, etc. The rules governing biological nomenclature laid down by the International Code for Zoological Nomenclature should be strictly followed.

Please use the International System of Units (SI) symbols and those recommended by the International Nomenclature. Abbreviations should be defined in brackets after their first mention in the text. Standard SI units may be used without definition in the body of the paper.

Ethical Approval and/or Informed Consent

The articles such as original research articles, review articles, case reports, or clinical studies must contain ethical statements. Statements are required if the work involves the use of animal or human subjects. The authors should ensure that all research has been reviewed and approved by an appropriate institutional committee.

- Studies on patients or volunteers require ethics committee approval and informed consent, which should be provided within the submitted manuscript.
- When reporting experiments on animals, authors should indicate whether the international, national, or institutional guidelines for the care and use of animals have been followed and that the studies have been approved by a research committee at the institution at which the studies were performed. Add an ethical statement and approved animal or study protocol number at the end of the material and methods section.

Violations of this policy may delay publication, lead to the retraction of the article, and notify your institution regarding the policy violation.

The following statements regarding ethical approval policy are suggested to be included in the text:

- ✓ All procedures performed in studies involving human participants were in accordance with the ethical standards of the institutional ethical committee and with the 1964 Helsinki declaration and its later amendments.
- ✓ Research related to human use has complied with all the relevant national regulations, institutional policies and in accordance the tenets of the Helsinki Declaration. It has been approved by the corresponding author's institutional review board or equivalent committee.
- ✓ For this study, formal consent is not required.
- Informed consent has been obtained and signed by from all individuals in this study.
- This article does not contain any studies with human participants or animals.
- The study protocol No.... was approved by the ethical/IACUC committee at the (add the institution's name).
- ✓ All applicable national and institutional guidelines for the care and use of animals were followed
- ✓ ARRIVE (Animal Research: Reporting of *In Vivo* Experiments) guidelines for the use of animals were followed.
- ✓ Animal care and handling were carried out under the institutional guidelines
- ✓ Mice were housed and maintained in a pathogen-free environment at the Department of Comparative Medicine. All experiments were performed according to the protocol No.... approved by (add the institution's name) IACUC.
- ✓ The research related to animals complied with all the relevant national regulations and institutional policies for the care and use of animals.

Conflict of Interest

 All articles must have Conflict of Interest statements at the end of manuscript. A competing interest is anything that interferes with, or could reasonably be perceived as interfering with, the complete and objective presentation, peer review, editorial decision-making, or publication of research or non-research articles submitted to Helminthologia. Competing interests can be financial or non-financial, professional, or personal. A declaration of all potential competing interests is required for the successful manuscript submission.

The following statements regarding conflict of interest are suggested to be included in the text:

- ✓ Authors state no conflict of interest.
- ✓ Authors have no potential conflict of interest pertaining to this submission to Helminthologia.
- ✓ Authors have the following potential conflict of interest to disclose (please describe).

Acknowledgement

Acknowledgements of people, grants, funds, etc., should be listed in a separate section before the References.

References citation in text

Please cite references in the text by name and year in parentheses as follows:

"...and with those of Gutiérrez-Galindo et al. (2010) which observed ... "

"A checklist of helminths in *N. vison* from Montana was reported by Barber and Lockard (1973)."

"...important waterborne pathogens, causing in some cases severe gastrointestinal disease (Baldursson & Karanis, 2011; Kumar *et al.*, 2014)."

"...causes of economic losses to pig industry (Roesel et al., 2017)."

Reference list

All publications cited in the text should be presented in the list of references. The authors should provide complete, correct, and properly structured references in alphabetical order of authors. If the article or book has a DOI number, the authors must provide it in the references section. This will automatically create active links, thus adding a greater value to a particular publication.

Author name(s) (year): Title in original language (if possible) [Title translated into English]. *Abbreviation of Journal*, vol.(no.): page information (according to type of publication) (In 'language')

Suppose you cite a work written in **a non-Latin script** (e.g., Chinese, Greek, Japanese, Russian). In that case, the original title of the reference must be transliterated into the English alphabet or only translated into English, followed by indicating the original language.

examples:

BYKHOVSKAYA-PAVLOVSKAYA, I. (1985): *Parazity ryb: rukovodstvo po izucheniyu* [*Parasites of fish: Manual on study*], Nauka, Leningrad, 121 pp. (In Russian)

or

BYKHOVSKAYA-PAVLOVSKAYA, I.E., KULAKOVA, A.P. (1987): Class Trematoda Rudolphi, 1808. In: BAUER, O.N. (Ed) *Key to the parasites of the freshwater fish fauna of the USSR*. Volume 3. Parasitic Metazoans (part two). Leningrad, USSR: Nauka Publishing Leningrad branch, pp. 77 – 198 (In Russian)

 Titles of references should be given <u>in English</u>. <u>Abbrevia-</u> <u>tion of journal titles should follow the rules of the NLM Title</u> <u>Abbreviation rules at:</u>

• Please <u>provide all authors' names</u>. Do not use *et al*. in the reference list unless there are more than ten authors.

Tables and Figures

We encourage authors to submit tables and figures SEPARATELY. Do not insert tables or figures in the text.

Tables

Each table should be numbered consecutively using Arabic numerals and referred to in the text by its number. Please provide a caption for each table refer to a table in the text. The number of lines should be limited using two horizontal lines, thus properly separating headings from data columns. Add one horizontal line below to determine the table. Vertical lines should be avoided. Please, do not present the same data in both the Tables and Figures. In general, Figures are preferable to Tables.

Figures

All photographs, graphs, illustrations and diagrams should be referred to as a "Figure" and numbered consecutively. Please insert keys and scale bars directly into the figures. Relatively small text and significant variation in text size should be avoided. Please provide a detailed legend (without abbreviations) for each figure and refer to each figure in the text.

For vector graphics, the preferred format is EPS; for graphs, MsExcel and MsWord files are also acceptable.

Scanned line drawings and line drawings in bitmap format should have a minimum resolution of 1200 dpi.

Halftone art – photographs, drawings, or paintings with delicate shading, etc., should have a minimum resolution of 300 dpi. Please use TIFF format for them.

Combination artwork should have a minimum resolution of 600 dpi.

Legends

The legends should be listed in a separate file.

Proofreading

Authors are informed by an e-mail that a temporary URL has been created from which they can obtain their proofs. Proofreading is the sole responsibility of the author. Authors should make their proof corrections (formal corrections only) on a printout of the pdf file supplied by the journal editorial office. Please re-check that text is complete and that all figures and tables are included. After the online publication, corrections can only be made in exceptional cases and only in the form of an Erratum which will be hyperlinked to the article.

In the case of the final check before manuscript acceptance and upon the corresponding author's request, scientific proofreading and language editing may be performed by journal editorial office. This kind of service price tag is 100 EUR/per article.

PDF copy for personal use is provided free of charge.

Journal does not have any article submission charges associated with manuscript submission or peer-review.

However, upon article successful peer-review and subsequent acceptance, there will be a fee of **350 Euros** (APC) associated with the Open Access publication cost.

The article processing charge (APC) will become effective for all manuscripts submitted to the Editorial Office **on** or **after January 15th, 2023**. The APC has adjusted annually depending on publishing costs determined by the publisher and journal editorial board.
